Call for Rosen Scholar Nominations

The Rosen Scholar is a fellowship created to honor the memory of Louis Rosen, his accomplishments, his hard work, and his affection for the broad range of science

performed at LANSCE. Louis Rosen's outstanding leadership and scientific career at LANL covered six-and-a-half decades and included both the initial concept for the Los Alamos Meson Physics Facility (LAMPF) during the 1960s and its commissioning in 1972.

Today LANSCE performs research in materials science using neutron scattering at the Lujan Center, dynamic materials at the Proton Radiography Facility, isotope production at the Isotope Production Facility, and both applied and basic research in nuclear physics at the ultra-cold neutron (UCN) facility, Weapons Neutron Research (WNR) facility, and the Lujan Center. More details on the available facilities and capabilities of LANSCE can be found at <http://lansce.lanl.gov>.

The Rosen Scholar fellowship is reserved for individuals recognized as scientific leaders in a field of research currently performed at LANSCE and who exemplify the innovative and visionary qualities of Louis Rosen. Both experimental and theoretical scientists are encouraged to apply. The Rosen Scholar is expected to be resident at LANSCE and bring his or her scientific expertise both to LANSCE and the broader Los Alamos scientific community. The position will support the Rosen Scholar at their current salary including relocation expenses for up to one year. Beginning date, end date, and duration (12-month maximum) for the scholarship are flexible, but must be between October 1, 2021 and September 30, 2022. Please include in

1, 2021 and September 30, 2022. Please include in your nomination package the dates you propose to be at Los Alamos.

Nominations are due by **March 1, 2021**.

Nomination packages should include a cover letter describing the qualifications of the nominee, a research proposal (3 pages maximum), and a curriculum vita with a publication list and list of invited talks.

The research proposals will be judged on scientific innovation, impact to the field, research approach, and the qualifications of the nominee. The proposal should briefly address at least one of the following:

- (1) Advancement of LANSCE's research portfolio or mission and
- (2) Future capabilities that advance LANSCE-based scientific research (including future facilities that might be co-located with LANSCE)

Proposal must be submitted using the attached template.

The nominee should arrange to have 3 letters of reference sent to rosen-scholar@lanl.gov.
