I have always been intrigued that we could even contemplate what happened during the first three minutes of the universe. Weinberg's book presents the experiments and theory in a simple, non-mathematical way and my goal in our course it to guide the class through the book, talk about how science has evolved since its publication in 1977, and explore the technology and people that made our understanding of this time possible.
