


Main messages

MWRA wastewater testing data






These periods are < 110 RNA copies/mL based on 7-day average

MWRA wastewater testing data (recent close-up)




MIT Community Trends

Total percent of cohort contracting Omicron




Daily # of students in isolation each positive case contributes over 5 days

COVID Management

- Other than higher rates for undergraduates in the last week (driven we believe by typical end-of-semester social activities), there are no significant patterns in the data.
- There is high demand for food deliveries to isolating students but we are responding.
- People continue to do the right thing (testing and masking when they have symptoms or are concerned about being exposed).
- We are making several thousand additional antigen tests available to our students, and our on-demand PCR testing remains available and effective for all in CovidPass (W20 and MIT Medical Trailer drop-offs).
- We also continue to make high-quality masks available (including via new vending machines).
